## Resource/Staffing Levels

- The Town of Edson provides 17 Regular Members out of the 23 at the Edson Detachment:
  - 1 S/Sgt
  - 1 Sgt
  - 3 Cpls
  - 12 Csts.
- Vacancies:
  - 1 Cst is on light duties







## Resource/Staffing Levels

- The Town of Edson provides 4.5 Support Staff positions of the 6.5 at the detachment:
  - 1 ME Supervisor
  - 3.5 MEs
- Vacancies:
  - 1 vacancy, in the process of being staffed







## **Crime Statistics 2022**

- Edson Detachment responded to 5769 calls for service in 2022
- 3491 were in the Town Of Edson
  - Person Crimes
    - -4 % decrease from 2021
    - -21% decrease from 2018
  - Property Crimes
    - -17% decrease from 2021
    - -37% decrease from 2018
  - Other Criminal Code Crimes
    - +63% increase from 2021
    - -21% decrease from 2018

## **Property Crime - Details**

- **B&E:** 64% businesses, 20% outside buildings / garages, 16% residences.
- Theft Under \$5000:
  - 43% are from MV (from the back of trucks, unlocked vehicles and L-P are the most frequent incidents)
  - 26% are shoplifting incidents.

# **Annual Performance Plan Priorities 2021 – 2022 Goals**

- From April 1 2022 to March 31 2023:
- Crime Reduction
  - 10% Reduction of thefts (over / under / vehicles)
  - 1200 Visibility patrols (town and county combined)
  - 6 Self-generated drug investigation by GIS
- Community Engagement
  - 30 Community Contacts
- Training (internal priority)
  - 4 In-person for the members







## **APP Results – Crime Reduction**

#### 10% Reduction of thefts (over / under / vehicles):

- In 2022-2023 we saw a combined reduction of 23% of thefts in Edson.
- Staffing level, patrols and visibility, CRU direct impact on this number.
- November Warrant round up 35 people arrested on multiple warrants, another 25 were checked but had moved







### **APP Results**

- 1200 Visibility patrols (town and county combined):
- In 2022-2023 we completed 2014 patrols, 1153 were in the Town of Edson alone.
- CRU: Targeted local prolific offenders, 4 pro-active drug files, multiple warrants executed, traffic enforcement in problem areas, provided support to GIS and GD members, liaised / worked with oil and gas reps.







### **APP Results**

#### 6 Self-generated drug investigation by GIS:

- In 2022-2023 GIS completed 1 pro active investigation.
- GIS was collapsed due to resource shortages (Sept to Nov).
- Some larger investigations limited their pro-active capabilities:
  - the sexual assault cases at the schools,
  - housing situation in Marlboro
  - Suspicious death / b&e
  - Bait truck operation
- CRU also assisted GIS with their pro-active work, and it has been successful.







## APP Results-Community Engagement

#### **Community Contacts - 30 contacts**

#### 61 community contacts were completed in 2022-2023

- Presentations in schools, attending Canada Day and Remembrance Day activities, the Edson Jamboree, the Bike Rodeo, Gold Rush Daze, Medicine Lodge Rodeo, Lunches with Seniors at the Pioneer Cabin and Town Halls
- Aside from the 61 contacts, the Edson RCMP sent out 27 media releases, attended COP meetings, attended council meetings, met with CAOs, met with protective services departments.
- Members completed 59 school visits / contacts







## **APP Results - Training**

In 2022-2023, 14 members improved their knowledge through different courses. Some of the courses were:

- Property Examiner Course
- Radar and Laser
- Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW)
- Incident Command System 200 (ICS)
- Violence Treat Risk Assessment (VTRA)
- Firearm Investigation
- Human Sources
- Police and Public Safety Instructor Course





## **Budget**

- At Q4, budget is approx. \$19,000 over the initial forecasted budget, but lower than mid year adjustments:
  - Initial: \$ 2,651,540
  - Mid Year Adjustments: \$2,740,756
  - End of Q4: \$2.670,627
- Drivers on the budget:
  - Forecast was for 16 positions, FTE 16.13
  - Guards more prisoners
  - Fuel cost is driving the numbers up
  - Overtime was kept below what was forecasted







# Annual Performance Plan 2023-2024 Goals

#### Crime Prevention goals:

- Property Crime down 5%
  - Work with community partners like COP, CPOs, Oil Gas Companies,
  - CRU
  - Prolific Offender Management
  - Drug Investigations
  - Warrant round up

#### 1400 Proactive Patrols

- Police visibility in the community
- Patrolling recreational areas
- Traffic enforcement
