1. Overview

The Town of Edson, in collaboration with the University of Alberta and the Town of Drayton Valley, is pleased to introduce the *Edson TAB Program (Tuition Assistance Bursary)*. This pilot program offers financial support to residents and students connected to Edson who are **pursuing post-secondary education or trades training in 2025**.

This initiative was developed in partnership with the Town of Edson Youth Council and reflects a shared commitment to investing in local talent and supporting future-ready education pathways.

2. Purpose

The purpose of the Edson TAB Program is to:

- Reduce financial barriers to post-secondary education and trades training.
- Encourage community involvement and recognize local youth engagement.
- Promote equitable access to opportunity for Edson-affiliated students entering a diverse range of academic or vocational fields.

3. Structure of the Program

- A total of 10 bursaries valued at \$1,000 each will be awarded to tuition-based expenses only
- 5 bursaries will be designated for individuals entering a recognized trade or apprenticeship program.
- **5 bursaries** will be designated for individuals entering a **traditional post-secondary institution** (e.g., college, university, or polytechnic).
- All approved funds will be disbursed directly to the recipient upon the receipt of a legitimate invoice from the institution
- Funds must be used for program enrollments beginning in 2025 and beyond

4. Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must:

- Be pursuing post-secondary education or trades training commencing in 2025.
- Applicants must be or have been actively enrolled in an Edson-based school and graduated in Edson **or** reside within the Town of Edson.
- There is **no age restriction** for applicants.
- Submit a completed application form and supporting documents via growth.services@draytonvalley.ca
- Consent to the use of their name and general program details for public recognition and reporting purposes if selected.

5. Application and Adjudication Process

- Applications will be reviewed and awarded on a **first-come**, **first-qualified** basis until all 10 bursaries have been allocated.
- A **selection committee comprised of Town of Edson staff** will evaluate submissions using a structured point system.
- Priority will be given to applicants who demonstrate the following:
 - o **Extracurricular involvement** (e.g., clubs, sports, school committees)
 - Volunteerism (e.g., community service, non-profit work)
 - Work experience (e.g., part-time or full-time employment)

 Personal essay describing how the bursary would make a meaningful difference in the applicant's educational journey and if they intend to return to work back in Edson.

6. Program Timeline

- Launch Date: June 30, 2025
- Close Date: Open until all bursaries are awarded
- Applicants will receive notification of their status within four (4) weeks of submitting a complete application.

7. Reporting and Oversight

- The program is administered by the Town of Drayton Valley, with Town of Edson selecting the winning applicants.
- Final reporting will summarize applicant demographics (non-identifiable), institutions supported, and community impacts.
- This program is considered a **pilot** and will be reviewed after completion to assess impact, interest, and sustainability, both through the Town and the University of Alberta for research purposes.

8. Additional Notes

- Successful applicants will be required to provide proof of enrollment before disbursement.
- Bursaries are non-renewable and non-transferable.
- The Town of Edson reserves the right to amend the Terms of Reference with reasonable notice.
